



COACH TRIP TO ASSOCIATION TOURVILLE, GRAVELINES, FRANCE

This all-day trip to the historic fortified town of Gravelines, situated about halfway between Calais and Dunkirk, will provide an unmissable opportunity to see how work is progressing on the Association Tourville's hugely ambitious project to reconstruct a First Rate 17th century ship, the Jean Bart, designed as the centrepiece of a proposed historical theme park dedicated to Louis XIV's navy.

Gravelines itself lies on the banks of the River Aa, with a busy marina and some delightful waterside paths to stroll along. You can visit the Musée du Dessin de L'Estampe in Gravelines, situated in the arsenal in the heart of the town and, apparently, the only French Museum that features graphic arts as a speciality. There is also a lighthouse open to the public, Le Phare de Petit-Fort-Philippe. For those wishing to try out the local menus, there is a restaurant on the Association Tourville's site as well as plenty of cafés and bistros in Gravelines.
